Ear Infection

(Sinusitis, Gastritis & Urinary Tract Infection Formula)

A small tube connects the ear to the throat. A cold can cause the tube to swell and becomes blocked, trapping fluid inside the ear. A perfect place is created for the growth of bacteria causing infection.

Dr. Salar has had tremendous success in helping children and adults with middle ear infection. Patients often get quick results, with no need for follow up.

According to Dr. Salar's 15 years of research, one of the main contributing causes of middle ear infection is mineral deficiency of the walls of the inner ear. What are the symptoms?

The main symptom is an earache. It can be mild, or very painful. Babies and young children may pull at their ears and cry. They may have trouble sleeping. They may also have a fever. You may see thick, yellow fluid coming from their ears. This happens when the infection has caused the eardrum to burst and the fluid flows out. This is not serious and usually makes the pain go away. The eardrum usually heals on its own.

When fluid builds up without causing any infection, children often say that their ears just feel plugged. They may have trouble hearing, but their hearing usually returns to normal after the fluid is gone. It may take weeks for the fluid to drain away.

In spite of routine use of antibiotics, many children return to the doctor with repeated episodes of Otitis media, often shortly after a course of antibiotics has been discontinued. Ear Infection is the most common reason a child is taken to the doctor, with an estimated 30 million visits per year accounting for 12.4% of all pediatric consultations. It has been estimated that over 70 % of all children will have at least one episode of Ear Infection by the age of 3. The annual cost of diagnosis and treatment of Ear Infection is estimated to be over \$5 billion in the United States.

There has been no clinical trial studies supporting this information. Results are based on clinical experience and positive patient reports.
