For 10 days I was going to so many different doctors, the emergency room, and they all told me different things. They even put me on a medication with steroids in it for a while. Nothing would make me better though. A family member then suggested that we come here so we made an appointment. After the first ten minutes that I was here, I did not even cough once. I felt so much better after just one treatment. The next day I came again and I was all better. I have not coughed in the longest time. As soon as I got there they told me what was wrong and immediately started a treatment. After ten days I could breath again. Now when I come I am greeted by a friendly staff and a doctor who knows exactly what I need to get better with. Without this I do not know what I would have done. I probably still would be on a bag full of medicine, instead of the three or four that I have now. All of my family comes here now and we are very grateful. Thank you so much.

Medical Drs diagnosed as avian TB she took antibiotics for about 2 years she was on at least 3 to 4 different antibiotics at a time, her cough persisted and Drs wanted to operate to remove part of her lung that was affected. Because her immune system was weak she could not get better. Then she came to see Dr Farahmand and with his treatment her cough stopped. She would occasionally cough but that was all.

For about a month or so the cough returned frequently causing her to get breathless. Then she decided to see Dr Farahmand.

Dear Dr. Farahmand:

Your patient ~~is my~~ ~~good~~ ~~friend~~ who is my good friend and so is her family, advised me to send you via ~~the~~ ~~best~~ description of my current problem. In July 2003, I underwent an open heart surgery: a mitral valve repair performed by a minimally invasive technique. (My brief medical history before this surgery is attached as a separate page.) The surgery was successful: the mitral valve got repaired to 100% efficiency. In the course of several months after the surgery, I had a couple of flares of pericarditis and several flares of pleural inflammation/effusion. These flares were treated with various anti-inflammatory drugs, such as viox against pericarditis and indomethacin against pleural inflammation/effusion.

At the beginning of February 2004, I started coughing. I did not develop any other symptoms of a common cold or flu. I did not have any fever. For about 18 days, I did not take any drugs, hoping that the cough would go away by itself. I observed that the cough usually became worse in the evening. Besides, in the evening I had to put on me more warm clothes than usual - to feel comfortable. This was not typical for me: usually I feel always hot - not cold. This combination of the symptoms was similar to those I had during previous flares of pleural inflammation/effusion. So, I went to my family physician and he prescribed a course of indomethacin. In about 4 days, the cough was almost gone, but then it came back despite I continued taking indomethacin. In 8 days after the start of the course of indomethacin, my physician recommended to stop it and to take instead a 6-day course of steroids.

After the 6-day course of steroids that ended on March 10, my chest x-ray showed that there is absolutely no pleural effusion. My cough became much less frequent. Also, previously I had a feeling that my entire trachea was severely irritated - now the irritation got localized to just one point.

However, one week later there is no further improvement. I am still coughing and expectorating yellow mucus. There is also some rattling in the chest. I still have a hoarse voice. The cough gets worse by exposure to cold. The cough also gets provoked during the lectures I give to my students.

*I had a cough that could have been described as a "tinkling in the pipes". After receiving a treatment from Dr. Farahmand, the problem disappeared!
