However, we recently had a serious problem when our son Ben became very ill one Friday evening on August 5<sup>th</sup> 2005. The symptoms were intense every-hour diarrhea, vomiting even water, fever; stomach/body aching, weakness and dizziness. I thought we could make it to his regular Doctor on Monday morning, but I started to see that something was inside of him and it was trying to kill him. He actually asked me to save him on Sunday night.

I put him in the car and headed to the closes emergency hospital UCLA Medical Center in Santa Monica, by then he was barely talking and he could not walk. The emergency doctor said he had a virus and it would go away. I explained the symptoms and I told them that he was extremely dehydrated. We have great insurance and I wanted him admitted. The doctor did not feel that that was necessary. They administered 400cc of liquid through an IV into his arm. They also said that there is no medication for children's diarrhea and it was better to let it all come out. I asked the doctor several times if they would take a stool sample to test the virus and find out what it was. They ignored my repeated requests even though we were there for four hours and he had diarrhea twice while we were there. They said, "It's a virus we don't need a stool sample".

The next day we when to his pediatrician in Pacific Palisades and to our surprise she said he looked OK and agreed with the UCLA doctor. No stool sample was necessary. Later that day, I decided that I wanted one anyway, so I drove back and got the special containers to collect the samples and then I took them back. They said we would know the results by the following week. By Wednesday the 10<sup>th</sup> my wife had it too and we were worried that Nathan could also get it. Whatever "it" was.

They were not getting any better so we called Dr. Farahmand and went to see him on Friday August 12<sup>th</sup>. He checked Ben and Heather and prepared the medication. By Saturday night Ben and my wife were feeling much better, but still had diarrhea. On Sunday my wife was pretty good and we were not worried about Ben any more.

Tuesday morning August 16<sup>th</sup> we got a call from Liz at the Los Angeles County Health Department with a hundred questions for us. She reported to us that the lab results showed that our son Ben had a bad strain of Salmonella poisoning. This can often be fatal for children his age if not treated or diagnosed properly. We think it was a sunny-side up egg he ate that was not cooked well enough that Friday morning by our housekeeper.
